Donor Charter

The Royal Society of Edinburgh (RSE) is grateful and committed to its donors and is dedicated to treating Fellows, Friends and all supporters with the highest level of care and respect. This charter intends to assure donors and prospective donors of the integrity and accountability of the RSE's Development activities.

RSE donors and prospective donors can expect:

- To be informed about the RSE's priorities and its strategic aims and objectives.
- To be treated by members of staff, Council and Committee members, and volunteers involved with the solicitation and receipt of gifts in a fair, transparent and accurate manner in accordance with all applicable laws and the professional code of fundraising ethics and good practice.
- To receive philanthropic financial asks and stewardship reports from the RSE that are truthful and accurate.
- To receive timely acknowledgment, appropriate recognition, and publicity for their donation in accordance with their wishes. To have their gift treated as anonymous if requested.
- To be informed when the intended purpose of a gift can no longer be fulfilled due to charitable legislation or due to a change in the priorities or needs of the RSE. In such cases, the RSE will discuss this with the donor and assess how best their wishes can continue to be met.
- To be kept informed of the impact of their philanthropy and the RSE's evolving needs and priorities. Where appropriate, this may mean receiving progress reports on supported activity and invitations to attend relevant events to see first-hand the benefits their support brings.

- To have their details removed from the fundraising database or the number / type of solicitations limited if so requested.
- To have access to the most recent published financial accounts and be assured that the RSE's financial affairs are be conducted in a responsible manner, consistent with the ethical obligations of stewardship and legal requirements of the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator.
